YESHUA IN THE FALL HOLIDAYS

Session Summary

Yom Kippur is not only a holy day but can be personally challenging. Forgiveness can be difficult to both give and receive. But on Yom Kippur, various customs help the process of embracing God's atonement. Those customs can significantly impact our ongoing relationship with God and people.

KEY TERMS

Book of Jonah

The Biblical book traditionally read on the afternoon of Yom Kippur.

Teshuvah

The Hebrew word which means **repentance**.

Vidui Prayers

A broad section of prayers on Yom Kippur that involves confession.

Ashamnu

A short section of prayers on Yom Kippur that involves confession.

Kol Nidre

This Hebrew word means **all vows**. It is a special **confession** service on the evening of Yom Kippur.

Nilah

A Hebrew word meaning **closing**. This word refers to the final prayer service at the end of Yom Kippur.
