For good reasons, the story of Cain and Abel is deemed tragic. However, there are valuable lessons to be gleaned from the Bible's first family. In this session, Rabbi Jason encourages us to learn from the examples of both characters so that we can be those who "give of ourselves" today.

The Hebrew word for *know*, in an intimate sense.

Hevel

The Hebrew name for Abel, meaning *vanity*.

Kayin

The Hebrew name for Cain, meaning to acquire.
